

**EXHIBIT G2- GROWER/GROVE MANAGER
INSIDE QUARANTINE AREA AND OUTSIDE CORE**

**PROVISIONS FOR THE
INTRASTATE MOVEMENT OF ALL EXOTIC FRUIT FLY HOST MATERIAL (FFHM)
ORIGINATING FROM AREAS QUARANTINED AN FOR EXOTIC FRUIT FLY**

1. Notification to Project

Establishment shall notify the Project at least 24 hours prior to harvest.

2. Approved handling

Establishment shall ensure shipments ***originating from the growing location(s)***:

- a) Completed a Pre-harvest bait treatment that has been monitored by the Project, **or**
- b) Delivered to processor or post-harvest treatment facility under compliance with the Project.* **And,**
- c) Harvested and hauled/transported by establishments under compliance with the Project.*

Foliar treatment options for growers inside the quarantine area but outside the core include:

- Malathion 8 Aquamul® (active ingredient: malathion) is used to treat avocados, citrus, stone fruit, pome fruit, fig, grape, walnuts, brushberries, caneberries, fruiting vegetables, pecans, cucurbits, and others as mentioned on the product label. Use of Malathion 8 Aquamul requires premixing with a Project approved protein bait lure. May be applied via aircraft or backpack sprayer, mechanically pressurized sprayer, or groundboom.
 - Malathion bait stations shall be applied every 6 to 14 days until harvest is complete. All previous treatments are voided if the grower exceeds the 14 day interval period between treatments.
 - Special Local Need (SLN) CA830012 must be in possession of the applicator and supervisory personnel at time of treatment.
- GF-120 Naturalyte® Fruit Fly Bait (active ingredient: spinosad) is used to treat fruit trees and fruit crops. May be applied via aircraft or backpack sprayer, mechanically pressurized sprayer, or groundboom.
 - Spinosad bait stations shall be applied every 7 to 10 days until harvest is complete. All previous treatments are voided if the grower exceeds the 10 day interval period between treatments.

For pre-harvest treatments, a minimum of four (4) applications must be made during the pre-harvest treatment period in order for the crops to be eligible for movement within or outside the quarantined area. The pre-harvest treatment period is a minimum of 30 days but can be longer, depending on the life cycle degree-day calculations. The grower may alternate treatment intervals to decrease the number of required treatments.

3. Verification for Each Shipment from the Growing Location(s)

- a) A copy of this signed *Exhibit* must accompany each shipment delivered to a packer/processor/post-harvest treatment facility or fruit seller (including certified farmer's market).
- b) *Treatment verification* must accompany all shipments destined to a packing house or fruit seller.

4. Notification for untreated FFHM Moved Out of the County Where the Quarantine Exists

The **destination Agricultural Commissioner must be** notified *at least 24 hours* prior to transport of any shipment of FFHM out of the county where the quarantine exists. Notification shall be by the CAC's preferred method (i.e. Email, phone, fax) and include:

- a) Receiver (name and complete physical destination address)
- b) Date of shipment and estimated date/time of arrival
- c) Weight or amount (number of trucks, etc) of fruit in shipment

5. Grove Manager

- a) Owner must provide the Project with a list of all parcel numbers within this quarantine that have FFHM which are to be managed by said Grove Management Company.
- b) Grove Management Company must submit a complete Grove Management Company Authorization document.

- 6. Inspection**
Establishment shall allow agricultural officials to inspect the premises to ensure compliance with this agreement, and obtain and review records of all shipments destined to locations outside the exotic fruit fly quarantine area.
- 7. Records**
Establishment must maintain records of all FFHM leaving the quarantine area and must make records available to the Project immediately upon request.
- 8. Training**
Ensure all employees receive training to be compliant with all specifications of this exhibit.
- 9. Compliance**
Failure to comply with all stipulations of this exhibit may result in fruit seizure, violations being issued to you, and/or revocation of this agreement.
